Financial assistance

Businesses affected by declared natural disaster events may be eligible for financial assistance under the joint Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangement. This support is administered by the Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority (QRIDA) who offer a range of financial programs to assist small businesses and primary producers including disaster assistance.
