Jake Moss	Jake attended two international art residencies, one in Spain and another in France, to further enhance their skills, career and connections as a Brisbane artist, filmmaker and writer. He documented his experiences and knowledge gained in Spain and France while creating a series of artworks while there.
Jessie Hughes	Jessie participated in Pictoplasma's coveted 10-day intensive Character Development Course in Berlin, followed by a two-week TV Screenwriting program at London's esteemed National Film and Television School. The culmination of these skills' development courses advanced their abilities as a creator of animated TV while establishing international networks.
Elle Croxford (auspiced by The Trustee for the Croxford Family Trust)	During a mentorship with Queensland Theatre's Artistic Director and senior dramaturg, Elle adapted The Sentimental Girl screenplay as a theatre playscript and held a public table reading and Q&A upon completion.

Students were equipped with skills for producing broadcast-quality audio documentaries and podcasts. The outcome of the project was an online and in-person learning resource which will be used multiple times a year over at least the next 5 years for training future students.	
Georgia Boe (auspiced by The Trustee for The Milani Family Trust)	Georgia undertook a structured learning opportunity with artist Richard Bell, as the project manager for his Embassy artwork at documenta15 in Kassel, Germany. documenta15 is a prestigious international contemporary arts exhibition. Embassy is a roving platform for First Nations dialogue, where Georgia was mentored by Richard for the entirety of the project.
