Draft Stones Corner Suburban Renewal Precinct Plan

At its meeting on 10 September 2024 Brisbane City Council proposed a tailored amendment to *Brisbane City Plan 2014* and changes to a planning scheme policy to introduce the new Stones Corner Suburban Renewal Precinct Plan (proposed amendment) as part of the Eastern corridor neighbourhood plan. The proposed amendment applies to parts of the suburb of Stones Corner and also includes consequential changes to the wider Eastern corridor neighbourhood plan area.

The purpose and general effect of the proposed amendment is to:

- amend the Eastern corridor neighbourhood plan code as it applies to Stones Corner and consequential changes to the wider neighbourhood plan area;
- amend the tables of assessment for certain types of development in the Eastern corridor neighbourhood plan;
- amend zones, neighbourhood plan and overlay maps to respond to finer grained planning for the area; and
- amend the Infrastructure design planning scheme policy to update references to the Eastern corridor neighbourhood plan.
