

Managing traffic disruptions

Council will work hard to minimise traffic disruption throughout the Indooroopilly Roundabout Upgrade project.

How we manage traffic disruptions

The level of traffic management required depends on a variety of factors, including the location and complexity of the works.

Projects in busier areas such as Indooroopilly, require a higher level of traffic management, as motorists, cyclists, pedestrians and workers interact with heavy equipment.

The construction contractor is required to submit traffic management plans to Council for review prior to any works starting. These plans are thoroughly reviewed by Council engineers to ensure they comply with the requirements of the Manual of Uniform Control Devices (MUTCD).

The project team will be working closely with Council's Congestion Reduction Unit (CRU) with regard to lane closures and detours to ensure the most efficient traffic management plans are in place for all road users.

How we manage traffic during construction

Traffic conditions will change progressively as the works proceed and we ask all road and footpath users to stay alert, be patient and pay close attention to the latest project signage.

Traffic management methods include:

- using safety barriers between traffic and construction zones
- reducing speed limits around the works area
- temporary lane or road closures
- installation of road signage
- working during the night when traffic volumes are at their lowest.

Signage will be in place to safely direct road users around the site. Council urges motorists to take care when passing through the work site and follow the directions of traffic controllers.

How we communicate traffic changes

Wherever possible, Council will provide advanced notice to local residents, the wider community, pedestrians and road users, outlining any changes to road conditions that may impact their daily commute.

Council uses the following notification methods to inform the community:

- electronic messages signs around the project on Moggill Road and Coonan Street
- information on Council's website (search: Indooroopilly Roundabout Upgrade)
- works notices delivered to local residents
- newsletters to let the wider community know the current project status
- email and SMS notifications to stakeholder and road user groups – register for regular updates on Council's website (search: Indooroopilly Roundabout Upgrade).

We will continue to speak with key stakeholder groups such as local emergency services.
